Highlights of your GUIDED TOUR can include These attractions:

A visit to **Behalt** (meaning to "keep or remember"). This will introduce your guests to the Amish / Mennonite heritage. The 10' x 265' foot cyclorama illustrates the history of the Amish and Mennonite people from their early Anabaptist beginnings in Zurich, Switzerland, in 1525, to the present day.

Located in the heart of **Amish Country in Ohio, The Farm at Walnut Creek** hosts over 500 animals, comprised of species from six of the seven continents. The menagerie includes **exotic animals** such as **giraffes, camels, zebras, and kangaroos** along with more common animals like **horses, llamas, and deer**. **Guests will have the opportunity to view and hand-feed the animals from a horse-drawn carriage.**

This is a working farm and as such, the type of activities visitors may witness during a visit change with the seasons. Depending on the time of year, you may see plowing, thrashing, canning, quilting and more. You can **tour the non-electric farm houses, buy produce at our farm stand, and take pictures of all that you see.**

David Warther Museum with a PRIVATE DINNER INCLUDED -



The exhibit features five different rooms and over 80 carvings made by David Warther.

David is a 5th generation carver of Swiss heritage. The carvings created by Warther depict the "History of the Ship" from 1st Dynasty Egypt to the present day. Created in miniature from legal antique ivory and ebony wood the details include intricate scrimshaw engraving and finely carved ivory rigging lines that measure just twice the thickness of a human hair. David carves daily in his on-site workshop where he regularly demonstrates carving techniques to the visiting public including his hand filing and sanding technique of making the ivory rigging lines.

FOLLOWING TOUR guests are invited to sit down to enjoy a delicious catered meal with David and his wife Mary Ruth. The meal is prepared by a local, fully-licensed caterer, and includes a plated entre, salad, dessert, and beverage.

Guests will love sampling all the Amish baked goods which are made on-site. Twenty Amish and Mennonite women work in the bakery. On an average day, the bakery bakes 250 loaves of bread (on some days it has been as high as 700), 100 dozen cookies and over 100 pies. The bakery also jams, jellies, spreads and more. **Taste Test and Bread for all.**



Homestead Furniture Factory and Showroom Take a tour through the factory where you can see the Amish craftsmen building furniture from

start to finish. See the color experts at work and walk out on the catwalk to overlook the shop floor. Next you are invited to relax in the gardens. Get some quality R&R by the waterfalls, see the trees from which they build the furniture Finally, explore the 27,000 square-foot showroom displaying hundreds of standard furniture pieces that are just a small sample of what is offered. There are three floors dedicated to hardwoods, upholstery and accessories to coincide with any style of décor.



Following tour **guests will have a traditional Church Lunch** at the event center. This is similar to what the Amish would enjoy after one of their church services. Note: Congregations are typically 25-35 families in size, around 100-150 people. Church is held in Amish homes. 4
